

Sweet Success for Italy at International Wine Challenge 2024

The <u>International Wine Challenge</u>, the world's most influential, impartial and rigorously judged global wine competition, has announced the six highest scoring Italian wines in its 2024 competition, with wines from Tuscany, Sardinia, Veneto and Trentino-Alto Adige all making the list.

In its 40th year, the International Wine Challenge awarded medals to 38 countries following an intensive blind tasting by a global panel of experts. Italy came fifth for medals overall, with six Italian wines being awarded coveted trophies. The country also claimed one of five Champion trophies with a Vinsanto from Tuscany being recognised as the best sweet wine in the world.

This year's star of the show was **Tenuta Di Capezzana**'s Vinsanto di Carmignano Capezzana Riserva 2016 which claimed back the prestigious title of IWC Champion Sweet Wine from Germany. This Vinsanto has won the trophy three times previously, in 2022, 2021 and 2019.

Over 160 Italian whites were awarded medals in this year's challenge but it was the Aransat 2022, a skin contact wine from **Borgo Savaian di Stefano Bastiani**, that took home the Italian White Trophy. This is the first time in IWC history that a skin contact wine has won this trophy. Judges described Aransat as "very classy," praising its "enticing mandarin orange, quince and yellow apple favours."

The introduction of the Italian Fortified Trophy in 2024 is proof that Italy's fortified wine can compete on the international stage. This trophy went to Sardinian producer **Silvio Carta** for its "challenging, complex and unusual" Vernaccia di Oristano Riserva 2006, which judges described as "a real treat."

Soave was the only Italian sub-region to gain its own trophy with the Soave Trophy going to **Inama Azienda Agricola** for its Foscarino 2021. Judges enjoyed the "subtle saffron and wild herb aromas" and "mouth-watering finish."

Of the 142 Italian reds awarded medals in this year's challenge, the top spot went to a wine made from the Lagrein grape variety native to the South Tyrol. **CAVIT** won the Italian Red Trophy for its "earthy, savoury" Bottega Vinai Lagrein Trentino 2021. This cooperative group took home an additional 10 medals for its red, white and sparkling wines.

Veneto producer **Bisol1542** won the Italian Sparkling Trophy for its Valdobbiadene Superiore di Cartizze 2023, which judges described as "fresh frothy and floral with a lovely Glera quality of stone fruits and citrus."
